The well-known evangelist of the early 20th century, Billy Sunday once said, "Going to church don't make anybody a Christian, any more than taking a wheelbarrow into a garage makes it an automobile." If you want to be a car, you have to look like a car, sound like a car, and do what a car does. AND you have to have gas to go.

In a similar way, if you want to be a Christian disciple, you have to do what disciples do, and be what disciples are, and, of course, you have to have something to make you go. And the thing that makes us go is the Holy Spirit.

On Sunday, May 20th, Christians around the world will be observing Pentecost, when the disciples of Jesus received the Holy Spirit, and began to witness to the person of Christ - who Christ was, what Christ did - and they began to live out their faithful response. We believe that this was when these first followers became the Church, because the Church is the community of believers who, with the Spirit's inspiration and power, witness to Jesus Christ.

You may have your name on the membership role of some church - maybe even this church, but that, in and of itself, doesn't make you a disciple of Jesus Christ. However, when you use the Holy Spirit's power to witness to Jesus Christ in what you say and do, and when you actively participate in some way, in the Church's mission of making disciples for Jesus Christ, that is when you become a Disciple and a Member of Christ's Church.

I hope to see all of you in Worship and Sunday School this Pentecost Sunday, and throughout the summer. Yet, I hope you won't just come to "park it." I hope you'll come to have your spiritual "gas tank" refilled, and have your commitment to serve Christ's Kingdom renewed, and to be empowered again for ministry as the Church of Jesus Christ!

Day of Pentecost—May 20, 2018 Wear Red

Pentecost is one of the principal days of the Christian year, celebrated on the fiftieth day after Easter. The Greek word pentecoste means "fiftieth day." Pentecost is the day on which the Christian church commemorates the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles and others assembled in Jerusalem. It marks the beginning of the Christian church and the proclamation of its message throughout the world and is often referred to as the birthday of the church. The liturgical color for Pentecost is red.

Mother's Day—Sunday May, 13, 2018

Here are 8 ways to provide your mom with a message of honor:



- 1. Tell her one thing she did right. Write it in a card or on a note or simply tell her.
- 2. **Recall happy times and loving memories.** Again, think through the positive times of your relationship and be ready to talk about those times.

Church Conference

Approximately 40 members of the Kanopolis and Ellsworth congregations attended the April 25 Church Charge Conference held in the Ellsworth Sanctuary. Dennis Livingston, Hutchinson District Superintendent, presided over the meeting and led the discussion to consider the alignment of a new two-point charge composed of the Ellsworth and Kanopolis congregations and the approval of a compensation package for the pastor. After about an hour of explanation, questions and answers, the members present voted overwhelmingly to approve the details and pastor's compensation for the two-point charge. Besides the sharing of the Pastor no major changes are expected. Worship times are expected to remain the same in Ellsworth while Kanopolis is expected to change their Sunday Worship time to 9:15.
